RIDDLE-DEE-DUM

- Start the session with a discussion about what a riddle is
- Give your child some examples.
- Make this activity fun by playing with more people in the family like Grandparents, parents, sibling etc.
- One participant can ask these riddles and keep score, if needed.
- Award a point if the answer is correct, and give a fun action to do if the answer is incorrect (do five squats, jump 4 times, walk like a penguin, waddle like a duck etc.)
- Give some fun clues if the child is not able to give the answer in a jiffy.



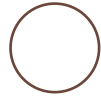
Let's play

3. What has hands but doesn't clap? **Solution - A clock**



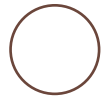
4. If a red house is made of red bricks, and a yellow house is made of yellow bricks, what is a greenhouse made of?

Solution - A teapot

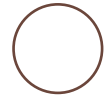


10. I'm tall when I'm young, and I'm short when I'm old, what am I? **Solution - A candle.**

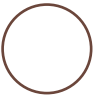
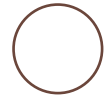




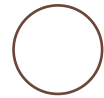
11. You draw a line. Without touching it, how do you make it a longer line? **Solution: Draw a short line next to it and now it's the longer line.**



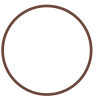
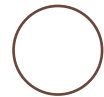
12. What is so fragile that saying its name breaks it?

Solution: A sponge



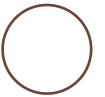
23. How many letters are there in the English alphabet?

Solution: Are you asleep yet?



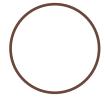
25. What becomes wetter the more it dries?
