Messy Play

Materials Required:

- A4 size sheet/ drawing sheet with pre-drawn flower
- Red, blue and yellow paints
- Plate or palette to mix the paints
- Paint brush
- Water in a bowl

How to

- Parent to pre-draw a flower with leaves and stem on a drawing sheet.
- Child to mix red and blue colour paints to make purple colour.
- Let the child paint flowers in purple colour using finger printing.
- Now, child to make green colour by mixing yellow and blue paints and paint the leaves in green colour, with a painting brush.
- Child to explore the magic of mixing colours



Sensory Play

Materials Required:

- Tray of about 1inch depth
- Semolina/ Rice/ Salt/ Sand or any child friendly sensory material

How to

- Parent to write letter 'n' on paper or on a slate to show to the child.
- Leave the child to explore the material.
- Child to attempt writing the letter 'n' in any of the above-mentioned sensory materials.
- Child must the say /n/ sound while tracing.
- Parent to assist the child only if they ask for help.



Block Play

Materials Required:

- Building blocks

How to

- Have a conversation with the child about helpers like teachers, cooks, drivers, security guards and house help and how they are helpful to us.
- Encourage the child to explore and make a school bus for driver or a kitchen for the cook or a classroom for the teacher using building blocks.
- Child to talk about the tools that the helpers use.

Role Play – I am a Cook

Materials Required:

- Readymade playdough or homemade playdough
- Toy Kitchen set up with utensils and appliances

How to

- Help the child to set up a toy kitchen with utensils and appliances.
- Encourage the child to pretend to be a cook. Make the child wear a chef's hat and apron.
- Child to prepare items with play dough like spherical rasgulla, cone-shaped dosa, and cylindrical can of juice.
- Encourage the child to serve once done.
- The child to be sensitized to clean up after finishing the pretend play.
