**Dear Parent,
Kindly ensure that your child completes these
offline activities. You can repeat these
activities during the week as for children –
‘The more they repeat, the better they learn’.**



Pull out the ribbon

Materials Required:

- Empty bottles
- Ribbon/lace/thick thread

How to:

- Place a 2 feet long ribbon/lace/thick thread in a bottle and close the cap.
- Punch a hole or make a slit in the cap and pull out half inch ribbon.
- Next, give it to your child to pull out the rest.
- You can make a few variations by adding holes to the sides of the bottle.
- Ensure that the hole is small so that your child applies a little strength to pull it out.

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Role Play –Pretend to be helpers

Materials Required-

- Dress up clothes to resemble the helpers.
- Chef cap for cook with some vessels and spoons
- A slate and chalk/white paper and crayons for a teacher
- Whistle for security guard

How to-

- Provides clothes for children to dress up as teachers/security/cook/ and pretend to be one.
- You can guide and also pretend along with your child
- Encourage your child to visit the kitchen to pretend to be cook and cook different food items.
- You can also make a healthy sandwich along with your child.

Let's paint In and Out

Materials Required-

- Paints
- Tissue rolls
- Brush

How to-

- Provide your child with a tissue roll.
- Ask your child to point in and out of the tissue roll.
- Encourage your child to dip the brush in paint(any colour of the child's choice) and further paint the tissue roll using in and out strokes



Block fun

Materials Required-

- Blocks
- Props of helpers

How to-

- Provide your child with blocks.
- Encourage your child to imagine building boundary walls and make security guard sit.
- Encourage him/her to stack blocks to make a school and make the appropriate helper sit in the building.

Let's mop it out

Materials Required-

- Slates/blackboard/black or dark coloured paper
- Chalks(preferably dust free)
- Ice cream stick/pencil/paper roll(to make a mop)
- Some wool (to make a mop)

How to-

- Allow your child to draw with a chalk on either slate/blackboard/black or dark coloured chart paper.
- Next, let your child explore removing the markings with a paint brush dipped in water.
- The paint brush should be made to look like a mop by tying strands of thick thread or wool to an ice cream stick/pencil/paper roll.
