**Dear parents,**

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands on activity suggestions for the week.

### Language is fun!

#### Materials Required:

- Pictures of flowers/book/ magazines

#### How to:

- Provide books or picture cards of flowers.
- Let your child identify and name to flower.
- You can also provide your child with a magazine to turn pages and locate different flowers.

## Sensory Play

### Materials Required-

- A vase
- Real flowers.
- Water



### How to-

- Place a few flowers in a vase with water for your child to observe and construct his/her own knowledge of what happens. Ask questions like “Oh! Look those flowers in the vase still look so red and nice. I wonder why those flowers are drying/changing colour?”

## Block Play!

### Materials Required-

- Blocks (red blue and yellow to be there)
- Masking tape

### How to-

- Draw/paste a flower with 3 petals on the floor/chart paper/table.
- Encourage your child to sort and place red blocks in 1 petal, blue blocks in the other petal and yellow blocks in the last petal.



## Role Play

### Materials Required-

- Flower shaped beads/any beads/flower cutouts with holes punched.
- Real flowers/artificial flower bouquets
- Real flowers/artificial flower garlands

### How to-

- Provide flower shaped beads/cutouts of flowers with a hole punched and encourage your child to lace them and make a garland to pretend play as flower seller.
- You can also provide plastic flower bouquets for your child to buy and sell (Parents and child can take turns to be the buyer and seller).

## Playdough fun !

### Materials Required-

- Playdough – red, blue and yellow
- A4 sheet with 3-4 outlines of flowers drawn

### How to-

- Provide your child with playdough and encourage him/her to try and make flowers using the playdough.
- Next, provide your child with an A4 sheet with outlines of flowers drawn and encourage him/her to pat the playdough inside the outline.
