To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands-on activity suggestions for the week

Number 5 Activity

Materials Required :

- Pre-Drawn Circle with No.5 written inside it (on table top/ A4 sheet)
- A bag of 5-10 toys of the child
- 5- 10 blocks/ straws/ ice- cream sticks

How to

- Parent to make a big circle on the table top/ A4 sheet and write No. 5 inside it.
- Child to name the shape and number.
- Child to then, count and keep 5 of his/her favourite toys inside the circle.
- Child to count and keep 5 red blocks, straws, ice cream sticks inside the circle.

My Animal Friends

Materials Required:

- Any Picture Book with Animal Pictures

How to

- Let the child look at picture books on animals and try counting the number of animals in page no 1
- Encourage the child to find Number 5 written in the book.
- Encourage the child to also look around the home environment to find where they can see numbers 1 – 5. For e.g. wall clock, calendar, OMO Book, Any other book, etc.

Messy Play

Materials Required:

- A4 sheet / Drawing Sheet
- Black paint and paint brush
- Glue/ glue stick
- Bow cut out (optional)
- Black round face cut out with chart paper
- White round 'mouth' and eyes, cut out of chart paper
- Pink chart paper cut out for ears and nose
(Cut outs as per reference picture)

How to

- Help the child to paint black colour on hand and make the handprint on the sheet of paper.
- Provide paper cut outs for face, eyes, ears, nose, mouth and bow.
- Ask the child the name of the animal and what sound it makes.



Mess Alert



Role Play – I am a Vet

Materials Required :

- Set up of a Pet Store along with a vet's office - Table with stuffed animals, cash registers, boxes to carry "pets" in, play money.
- Set up of Vet's Office – Stuffed animals, bandages, doctor kits, large white shirts (for doctor coats), clipboards and crayons

How to

- Parent to help child to set up a Pet Store with a Vet's office.
- Let the child explore the different animals and play the role of a Vet and take care of the animals.
- Encourage the child to count the pet animals.
