

Worksheet – Help the farmer find his animals. Paste the farm animals in the farm.

Conversation tips while doing the worksheet – Talk to your child about farm animals- where they live, what sound each one makes and what they eat etc.



Note to Parents:

- Organize every activity in neat pouches & trays.
- Ensure easy accessibility for the child to encourage independent learning.
- Allow the child to choose. These activities can be repeated too. Encourage routines and procedures around pack-up and clean-up.

Dear parents,

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands-on activity suggestions for the week. Encourage the child to do a minimum of 2 per day.

Language is Fun!

Materials Required:

- Pictures of farm animals learnt so far.

How to:

- Place pictures of farm animals on the table.
- The parent to point to any animal and encourage the child to make its sound.
- Next, the parent to make the sound of the farm animals 1 by 1 and encourage the child to keep their hand on the corresponding picture.



Let's Count

Materials Required-

- Number chits/flashcards placed face down (1,2 and 3)
- A bowl with counters/beads/blocks

How to-

- Encourage the child to pick a flashcard/chit and further keep the corresponding number of objects beside the flashcard/chit

Sensory fun!

Materials Required-

- A4 sheet of paper with the letter p made on it.
- Small pieces of wool

How to-

- Let the child place small pieces of wool on letter the 'p'
