Dear parents,

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands-on activity suggestions for the week

Rainbow Fish

Materials Required :

- Tempera/ Poster paints of 7 colours – violet, indigo, blue, green, yellow, orange and red.
- 7 earbuds – for ear bud printing / cotton wool or tiny rolls of newspaper for dabbing. The child can even do pointer finger painting, if other materials are not available
- A pre-drawn image of a fish (as a reference image)

How to

- The child to count and identify the 7 colours.
- Encourage the child to paint the fish using the materials available.
- Encourage the child to talk about fish as a pet animal and a sea animal and discuss how many body parts a fish has as well as the names of the body parts etc.



Pet Animal Puzzles

Materials Required :

- Printouts or pre-drawn images of a Cat, Parrot and Rabbit (as the reference image)
- Black marker pen

How to

- Divide the Cat image into 2 equal parts, number them 1 and 2.
- Divide the Parrot image into 5 equal parts and number them 1 – 5
- Divide the Rabbit image into 7 equal parts and number them 1- 7
- Cut the images and jumble them up. The child can then attempt to sort out the images.
- Place the parts in sequence and form the full image of the pet animals.
- Encourage the child to identify the pet animals and talk about them.
