## Dear parents,

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands on activity suggestions for the week. Encourage the child to do a minimum of 2 per day.

## Art is Fun!

### Materials Required:

- Cutout of a fishbowl using a white sheet of paper.
- Cutouts of different coloured fish
- Crayons
- Glue/glue stick

### How to:

- Provide cutouts of the fishbowl and fish.
- Let the child colour the fishbowl blue and stick the fish inside to complete the artwork.



## Let's Discover

### Materials Required-

- Plastic papers or foam sheets(for cutouts of fish)
- Paper pins
- A transparent bottle
- Magnet

### How to-

- Make small fish with plastic sheets/foam sheets and pin the mouth using a paper pin.
- Place the fishes in a transparent bottle and tightly screw the cap.
- Give the child a magnet and encourage him/her to take it close to the bottle. The fish will get attracted to the magnet because of the paper pin. Let the child move the magnet up and down to observe the effect.



## Role Play!

### Materials Required-

- A tail made with newspaper
- Headgear/mask of dog/cat/parrot

### How to-

- Pretend to be pet animals and encourage your child to wag his tail like a dog or crawl like a cat. They can also make animal sounds like bark like a dog or purr like a cat, etc
- The child can also wear the dog/cat/parrot head gear or mask and pretend to be those animals.
