- Organize every activity in neat pouches & trays.
- Ensure easy accessibility to encourage independent learning.
- Allow the child to choose the activities. These can be repeated too
- Encourage routines and procedures around pack-up and clean-up.

Dear parents,

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands-on activity suggestions for the week.

Letter Recognition

Materials Required :

- Pre-written letters - **c, k, e, h, g, m, o, d, r, u and j** on an A4 sheet.
- Homemade or readymade playdough

How to

- The child to identify the letters written on the sheet and say the sounds of the letters.
- The child to then pull, pinch and roll the playdough.
- Circle the letters d, r, u and j with playdough.
- This game may be played with different letters at any other time too

Number Play

Materials Required:

- Homemade / readymade playdough balls or newspaper balls
- Empty ice tray/ egg cartons/ chocolate box with grooves
- Numbers cards – 1 - 7
- Tongs /tweezers/ fingers (optional)

Instructions

- Place the numbers cards 1 – 7 on the table
- The parent to hold up any one number card and show it to the child
- The child to say the number aloud and place the corresponding newspaper/ playdough balls in the ice tray.
- The parent to do the activity with the other numbers for reinforcement and revision
- To add a complexity and to strengthen the pincer grip, the child can be asked to pick up the playdough/newspaper balls with a pair of tongs and place them in the ice tray.

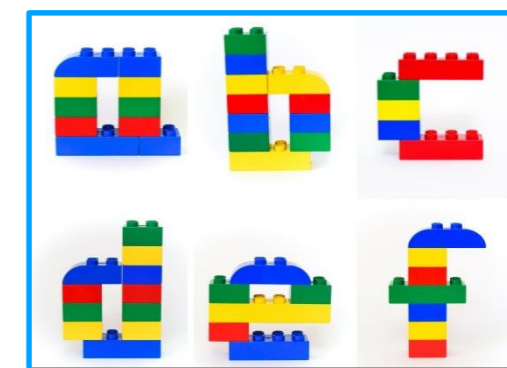
Block Play

Materials Required:

- Building blocks
- Numbers cards – 4,5,6,7 and letter flash cards – u, r, d and j

How to

- Encourage the child to identify the letters and numbers, one at a time
- The child to make the numbers looking at the number cards as reference
- The child to make the letters looking at the flash cards as reference



My Farm

Materials Required :

- Ice cream sticks
- Homemade or readymade playdough
- Green shredded paper/ dried grass (optional)
- Farm animal cutouts (from the previous week)

Instructions

- The child to look at the picture of the ice cream stick fence and make the same using sticks, glue and playdough
- Shredded paper or dried grass may be scattered all around the farm
- Paste ice cream sticks on the back of the animal cutouts and place the cutouts on the playdough to make the animals stand
- The child to sing the 'Old MacDonald Song' with the animals – cow, duck, hen, pig, goat and horse
