


# Fun time at home

## Have Intelligent Conversations With Him




### How to:

- Even though your child may not be able to immediately respond to you, he will be listening keenly.
- Ask him for his opinions, thoughts, likes, and dislikes.
- Listen to him when he responds, and repeat what he said using coherent, grammatically correct sentences.
- This can help him express himself better and improve his articulation.

## Pre-Writing Activity Tracing with Buttons

### Materials Required-

- Plain Paper with pattern
- Large Buttons



### How to-

- Get the pattern sheet to the child and show them how place the buttons right next to each other....Tracing the path drawn

## Shape Art

### Materials Required-

- White Chart Paper with large shapes drawn sheet
- Paints
- Thick Brushes /Sponges



**Note: Parents need to stick the White chart paper either on the floor or on the wall**

### How to-

- Allow the children use thick or sponge and paint on the shapes.

## A discovery basket for math

### Materials Required-

- sieves of different sizes, including large & fine holes
- measuring spoons :: a big and small teapot
- plastic measuring jug with a pint and litre scale
- a set of small, medium and large metal balti dishes
- a set of funnels in different sizes



### How to-

- Allow the children to play, experiment and ponder, for example, that a big jug holds more water than small jug.
- If you sit nearby you can observe their play, pick up on discoveries they've made, over hear questions they are posing.

## Dance party

### Materials Required-

- Props - Scarfs



### How to

Don't forget the power of music to help your child burn off some extra energy. Put together a playlist of music your whole family can enjoy. Then challenge *everyone* to dance, dance, dance!

Younger children might enjoy dancing with props, like scarves.

Variation for tweens: Play a game of Freeze Dance. When the music stops, everybody has to freeze in their current dance pose. If you move, you're out.

dance(2)


They all go merrily up together., they all go

## When Your Preschooler Says 'NO' To Everything

### **'Why Children Say 'No!'**

We might wonder why small children say 'No!' The 'No' allows them to control a situation to a certain extent and puts some power in their hands. It's just a different way of declaring their independence.

Parenting a demanding child is not as unusual as you imagine. You might even wonder if your child will ever say 'yes' to something at least. Even when you ask your child if he or she wants to come to the play area, what's the response? 'No!' The 'No' may be whispered, shouted or accompanied with a firm headshake, but the result is the same. You are left bewildered, angry or helpless! What can you do?

Dealing with all the 'Nos' is really tiresome but if one is patient, one can win over the child with an array of disciplinary techniques. The trick is not to let your child know that he or she is being disciplined!
