To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands on activity suggestions for the week.

## Block Fun!

### Materials Required:

- Blocks
- Toy ants/ant cutouts

### How to:

- Encourage the child to make ant hills that are triangle in shape with a square boundary and place toy ants in it.

## Role Play

### Materials Required-

- Big flower and leaf cutouts
- Dupatta
- Insect toys

### How to-

- Make a garden with big flower cut outs.
- Tie dupattas on the child's fingers and let them pretend to be bees and butterflies.
- Encourage your little bees to make the sound zzz as they fly around. Add interest by singing songs. .



## Insect Rescue Time

### Materials Required-

- Strings
- Tongs and tweezers
- Plastic insects
- Basket

### How to-

- Weave a web in a plastic basket using a cotton thread.
- Place plastic spiders and other insects inside the basket as shown in the image.
- Let the child try to take out the insects using tongs. They may even use their fingers to take out the insects.



## Insect Imprints

### Materials Required-

- Homemade / readymade playdough
- Plastic insect toys- ant, butterfly, etc.

### How to-

- Encourage the child to roll and pat the playdough
- Next, encourage the child to pick any insect of his or her own choice and name it.
- Let the child place and press the insect toy in the playdough and then remove it to see the insect imprint in the playdough .
