Dear parents,

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands on activity suggestions for the week

Language is Fun!

Materials Required-

- The child's favourite story book
- Puppets

How to:

- Encourage the child to narrate his/her favourite story either by using the storybook/puppets or objects.
- You can even prompt the child (do not narrate) and help to use the right words when needed.

Knock the Glasses!

Materials Required-

- Plastic /Paper Cups or Glasses
- A ball

How to-

- Encourage the child to stack and make a tower using the paper cups
- Place the glasses/cups at a distance and allow the children to throw the ball and knock down the glasses.



Block Fun

Materials Required-

- Masking tape/ paint
- Blocks

How to-

- Make letter 'm'(lowercase) on the floor using a masking tape/paints
- Encourage the child to say the sound for the letter 'm'.
- Next, let the child place blocks on the letter m.
- Once complete, you can sing the letter m song along with your child.

Let's Fly The Plane

Materials Required-

- 2-3 A4 sheets of paper

How to-

- Begin to make an easy paper plane along with your child. You can make 2-3 planes
- Paste some paper clouds on a wall to make it look like a sky
- Have fun as you fly your airplanes with your child
