Dear parents,

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands-on activity suggestions for the week

## Day and Night Activity

### Materials Required :

- Drawing Sheet
- Coloured chart paper with drawings of 3 light blue clouds, 1 yellow sun, 1 white crescent shape moon
- A pair of child-safe scissors
- Black and Blue tempera / poster colours
- Paint brushes

### How to

- Divide the drawing sheet into 2 halves. Paint one side blue and the other side black
- Cut the sun, moon and clouds from coloured chart paper

## Shadow Play

### Materials Required:

- Flashlight
- Building Blocks



### How to

- Encourage the child to build objects with letter sounds /g/, /o/, /l/ and /b/ like giraffe, goose, owl, orange, lamb, lamp, balloon, ball, etc.
- Provide a flashlight to the child and encourage them to make shadows by shining the light from different angles on their structures.
- Let the child observe how they can make the shadows larger or smaller?

## Origami – Tulip Flower

### Materials Required:

- Origami paper/ chart paper cut into 10X10 inches square – 2 different colours



### How to

- Take one square paper and fold it corner to corner across the center, making 2 exact halves. You now have a triangle.
- Fold the triangle by half horizontally. Unfold the triangle; you now have a center fold line.
- From the center point of the fold at the base of the triangle,, fold upwards on either side, so that it looks like the picture.
- Now turn the tulip on its back and make small folds on the edges, so that the folds are not visible when you turn the tulip back up front. The tulip head is now ready.
- You can now make another tulip flower with a different colour.

## Excuse Me, Please!

### Materials Required :

- 1 Paper plate
- Black marker pen
- Pink or yellow chart paper
- A pair of child –safe scissors
- 1 tissue
- Glue stick

### How to

- Encourage the child to draw 2 eyes, 1 nose and lips, with the black marker pen, on the paper plate.
- Let the child trace his/her hand on chart paper. The parent to help the child cut it out.
- Place a tissue over the drawn face and paste the hand and the tissue (refer to image)
- Encourage the child to recite the poem -

Remember this rule,  
won't you please.  
Cover your mouth,  
when you cough and sneeze.
