Language Development



How to:

- Reading to your toddler every night is a great way to introduce him/her to different words.
- Read him/her a simple book with pictures and ask questions related to the story.
- You can also try pointing at images in the book and ask him/her to identify them.
- This can help improve your child's vocabulary and teach him/her to give accurate responses to the questions asked.

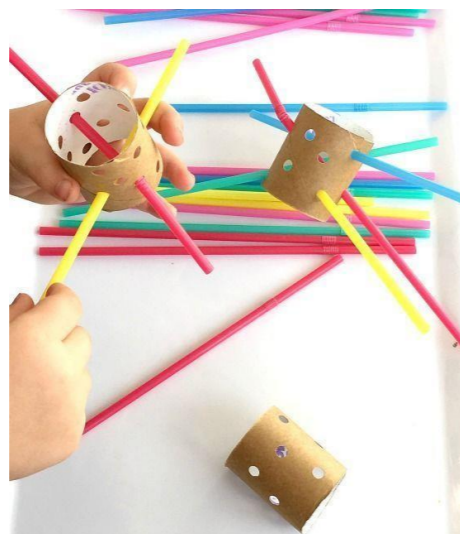
Passing Straws Through Tissue Rolls!

Materials Required-

- Tissue roll with holes punched in them
- Straws

How to-

- Show the numeral 5 flashcard to your child and encourage him/her to identify the same.
- Allow the child to count and keep aside 5 straws.
- Encourage the child to pass the straws through the holes punched on the tissue roll.



Block Fun

Materials Required-

- Blocks

How to-

- Encourage the child to make a train using blocks.
- Make a train track on a chart paper and encourage the child to pass the train through the track.



Tugging Box

Materials Required-

- Shoe box with some holes punched in them
- Lace/ribbon

How to-

- Punch holes in a shoe box and lace ribbons through the holes.
- Tie knots on both ends.
- Let the child exercise their fingers by pulling the ribbons.



Block Play

Materials Required-

- Blocks
- Masking tape

How to-

- Encourage the child to make the number 5 using blocks.
- You can also make number 5 on the floor using a masking tape and allow the child to place blocks on it.
