Dear parents,

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands on activity suggestions for the week. Encourage the child to do a minimum of 2 per day.

I Spy Game- Shapes

How to:

- This is a fun game to play while sitting in a restaurant or waiting in a line. Open a magazine or a menu and look for different shapes. Play an *I Spy game* and see how many different shapes your child can find.
- Start the game by simply stating, “I Spy the circle shape.”
- Encourage your child to find the shape you’re looking at. Is it on a sign, on a book, or on a page you’re reading?

Stacking by Size

Materials Required-

- Stacking toys by size

How to-

- Allow your child to stack by going small to big or big to small.



Colourful Ball Launch

Materials Required-

- Colourful plastic balls
- 2 Baskets (Any 2 colour)

How to-

- Allow your child to throw the balls in their respective coloured baskets.



Ice Cube Painting

Materials Required-

- Coloured ice cubes
- A4 size white sheet

How to-

- Make the coloured ice cubes prior to the activity. (Stick the ice-cream sticks in the ice cubes while setting)
- Allow the child to hold the ice cubes using ice cream sticks and paint on the paper.



Role Play

Materials Required-

- Plastic fruits and vegetables
- Trolley or basket

How to-

- Arrange all the fruits and vegetables in different baskets and let the child pretend play as a Fruit or Vegetable vendor.
- Let the child be the vendor and the parent can be the customer.
