**Dear parents,**

To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands-on activity suggestions for the week.

## Language Development



### **How to:**

- Reading to your toddler every night is a great way to introduce him/her to different words.
- Read him/her a simple book with pictures and ask him/her questions related to the story.
- You can also try pointing at images in the book and ask him/her to identify them.
- This can help improve his/her vocabulary and teach him/her to give accurate responses to the questions asked.

## Washy washy

### Materials Required-

- Tub of water
- Shampoo
- Plastic animals/toys
- Sponges/Brushes

### How to-

- Let the child bathe the animals using sponge and loofas.



## Messy Play

### Materials Required-

- A4 sheet/ Drawing sheet
- Water colours
- Water in a bowl
- Ink dropper/ straw/ spoon

### How to-

- Talk to the child about the monsoon season and encourage him/her to pick up a spoon/ ink dropper/ straw and dip it in paint of any colour.
- The paint should be watery (not thick).
- Let the child explore the material (spoon/dropper/ straw) and instruct the child to start at the top.
- Tilt the sheet a bit and let the paint drip down the sheet.
- The child may then take another colour to paint over the first one.
- Ask the child, what they are painting.
- Encourage independence and help only if the child wishes to be helped.

## Role Play- Popsicle Shop

### Materials Required-

- Different popsicle cutouts
- Popsicle wrappers
- Spoons
- Bowls
- Ice cream cones made with paper
- Pretend money

### How to-

- Show pictures and talk about your regular popsicle shops with your child.
- The child to set up a popsicle shop/cart. Give the child pretend money and paper bags to carry their purchases back home.
- Take turns to be the shopkeeper and customer



## Block fun

### Materials Required-

- Blocks
- Number flashcards-1-5

### How to-

- Encourage the child to pick a number card and further stack those many blocks to make a tall/short tower.
