



All the papers of a particular Course should be cleared within maximum of one additional year beyond the duration of the course. The result of Supplementary Examination shall be published at least 15 days prior to the End Semester Examination of the next Semester. The result for a review paper shall be published within 15 days of holding the review of the paper. A student failing to secure pass marks in a practical paper shall have to appear for his Supplementary Examination in the corresponding practical paper in the subsequent two batches for all the Semesters except for the last two Semesters of the Course when he will get one chance only with the subsequent batch. In all cases of back papers, the score on Internal Assessment of the original Semester shall be carried over.
