Welcome Note by the Chairman of IQAC, Prof. (Dr.) Deependra Kumar Jha, Vice-Chancellor

The Chairperson and Vice Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Deependra Kumar Jha welcomed all the members to the 1st IQAC meeting for the Academic Year 2021-22.

In his address, the Chair recommended the following:

- a. University to rationalize all the existing programs for optimization of resources.
- b. Office of QAA to institutionalize Curriculum Benchmarking across the University.
- c. Strengthening the office of QAA by assigning coordinators from each school who may become trainers/evaluators in the implementation of IQAF.
- d. Deans to chalk down plans for pedagogical improvement and innovation in Schools, in line with the aspiration of Gen Z Schools to have collaboration with industry partners for flagship programs with commercial implications, if any.
- e. Engaging students with varied modes of learning to gain new knowledge/technology and facilitating them through assignments, LinkedIn Learning, etc. All the deans to inculcate this habit among students by having 8 hours of teaching in class and 8 hours of assignments/ engagement activities like exploratory learning/experiment learning by February 2022.

He also **apprised** the Committee that the first Performance Management System (PMS) for Academic staff has been completed and University has identified & incentivized the key performers. The Committee **noted** the implementation of new learning management system CANVAS across all the schools of the University.

He **further informed** that the Academic Council in its last meeting has approved the establishment of the Centre for Lifelong Learning (previously known as Centre for Professional Studies) with 3 divisions:

- 1. <u>Life Skills Division</u> Offer courses pertaining to lifelong learning like Venture Ideation, Critical Thinking, Campus to Corporate, Dynamic Paradigm, etc.
- 2. <u>Professional Skills Division</u> Cater bureaucracy examination, competitive examination, and foreign language courses, etc.
- 3. <u>Upskilling Division</u> The division will be focussing on the needs of Adamas' alumnus by providing short-term courses and certified courses in an online/offline mode.

A director will be appointed to lead the centre along with 3 Assistant Directors who will be leading the three divisions and reporting to the Director.

The Chairman after ascertaining the quorum in place, agenda items were taken up for discussion.

Agenda Item No. 1:

To confirm the Minutes of the last meetings held on April 21, 2021, and May 22, 2021

The minutes of the last meetings of the IQAC held on April 21, 2021, and May 22 2021 were circulated previously on which no comments had been received. The minutes were therefore taken as read. There being no further comments, the Committee approved the minutes (Annexure 1.1).

Agenda Item No. 2:

Action taken report on the recommendations of the Committee in the previous meeting

As recommended by the Committee in its last meeting, Jyoti Bansal, Director IQAC presented to the Members (Annexure 1.2) the status of the action taken by all concerned on the matters from the last IQAC meeting held on April 21, 2021.

Agenda Item No. 3:

Status update of the Psychometric Profiling for the AU students; Presentation by Dr. Sumona Dutta, Assistant Professor, SOLACS

The committee **received** a presentation (**Annexure 1.3**) and **appreciated** the efforts put into preparing the psychometric profiling for AU students. Dr. Sumona Dutta **apprised** the members that three different sets of tests will be conducted on students and their careers/job profiles will be mapped based on different domains. Around 200 psychological profiles have been prepared and audited based on different combinations of personality traits, intelligence, and interest. The results interpreted will be available for the admin's view, mentor's view, and user's views. The result will be routed to the mentor's dashboard so that proper guidance could be provided to the mentee/students. The full software application is configured on the AWS server and post-deployment and system-testing, the software will be open to the target group (students) by November end.

The Members deliberated on copyrighting the software in the name of Adamas University in the future.

Agenda Item No. 4:

Roadmap to improve the full-time enrolment of Ph.D. Scholars, Research Fellows, JRF in the University; Presentation by Dr. Moumita Mukherjee, Dean R&D



The committee received a presentation (Annexure 1.4) from Dr. Moumita Mukherjee, Dean R&D on the roadmap to improve the full-time enrolment of Ph.D. Scholars, Research Fellows, JRF in the University.

Draft recruitment policy for JRF, SRF, and research associate with eligibility criteria & financial assistance details were presented to the committee members. The Chair **appreciated** the proposal & **recommended** Pro-Vice Chancellor (R&D Affairs) and Dean (R&D) to deliberate and discuss separately with him the number of research fellows to be hired by all schools based on vacancy and stipend amount to be given to the research fellows.

Agenda Item No. 5:

To consider and approve the appointment of Chair Professors for Adamas University; Presentation by Dr. Moumita Mukherjee, Dean R&D

Dr. Moumita Mukherjee, Dean R&D **proposed** (**Annexure 1.5**) the appointment of 10 University Chair Professor positions under various subjects/fields. The Committee suggested that the appointment of University Chair Professor need to be funded by a government body / non-government agency /Industry. The Chair **asked** the members to write their suggestions to Dr. Moumita Mukherjee, Dean R&D and that can be taken up in the next IQAC meeting.

Agenda Item No. 6:

New initiatives and best practices of School of Engineering and Technology (SOET); Presentation by Dr. Ashwini Kumar Sharma, Dean – SOET

A detailed presentation (Annexure 1.6) was made by Dr. Ashwini Kumar Sharma, Dean – SOET on the new initiatives and best practices implemented in the School of Engineering and Technology.

The new initiatives of the school are as under:

- a. Student-led social media platform
- b. Polytechnic and school outreach program led by Dr. T. Senthil Vadivel and Dr. Sajal Saha respectively
- c. School-level competitions like a hackathon, talent hunt, etc.
- d. Profiling of students and survey based on their aspiration
- e. Waste to wealth initiative
- f. Creating student experience from industrial/educational visits



- g. Created parents-faculty WhatsApp group for immediate feedback
- h. Offering 2 hours non-credited value-added course

Dean SOET, Dr. Ashwini Kumar Sharma has also apprised the committee about his school's best practices like regular meetings with class representatives, engaging students with different experiential learning activities like poster competition, discussion forum, quizzes, etc. The committee suggested that grooming the engineering school students for mock interviews should be done in association with the Office of Career Development. Deliberating further on the initiative of branding the school through student-led social media platform activities, the President - Chancellor Cell, Mr. Avik Dey, advised strongly that all the school deans have one strategy either centrally or by the schools themselves for social media marketing and branding of the schools of Adamas University.

The Chair advised all deans to submit reports of any events conducted at school within 7 days of its completion in the prescribed format and recommended Director IQAC to share a link with all the deans and HoDs of the School where the reports can be directly submitted.

Dr. Jitendra Kumar Pandey, Pro-Vice Chancellor (R&D Affairs) asked all the Deans to take initiative at the school level towards increasing the number of research papers and wherever it is applicable for patents. He further advised having a plan to measure the impact of any initiative taken by the school and have a closure report of the initiative. The Chair recommended all Schools to have a proposal document and SOPs of any initiative stating the clear anticipated outcomes and later to analyze the impact of the initiative,

Agenda Item No. 7:

Update on development of Employee Engagement Culture and AU Employee Engagement Principle; Presentation by Mr. Sovan Basu, Director – HR

The Committee received a presentation (Annexure 1.7) from Mr. Sovan Basu, Director – HR on the development of employee engagement culture and AU employee engagement principle.

He briefed the members that for Adamas University people are an important asset. The vision is to hire and engage A class team and the objective is to become a great place to work. He also apprised the Committee that a Happiness Officer will be appointed to make and keep the employees engaged and happy at work.



The Members noted that the HR department of the University has taken many key initiatives towards the development of the talents in the last academic year like streamlining the recruitment process of the University and introducing a performance management system (PMS) for the first time in Adamas University.

The HR department has also taken up the learning and development initiative for the staff and faculty members by organizing 20 professional development programs and staff development programs in a short span of 3.5 months. The Committee acknowledged the various employee engagement welfare measures taken up by the HR department like free of cost In-house Covid vaccination camp for all the employees of the University.

It is advised that more technical & specific professional development programs be organized in near future catering to the diverse needs of the staff of all support offices of the University like CDC, Registrar office, etc. along with a training calendar based on the requirements raised by the concerned office.

Agenda Item No. 8:

Execution of Value-Added Courses, IDPs, and Slow & Advance Learners Policy; Presentation by Dr. Rajneesh Kler, Associate Director, Planning and Monitoring

A presentation (Annexure 1.8) on the execution of value-added courses, IDPs, and Slow and Advance Learner Policy was presented to the IQAC members by Dr. Rajneesh Kler, Associate Director, Planning and Monitoring. The members deliberated on how to encourage the students to take up value-added courses and the following suggestions were put across by the esteemed Members:

- Offer the course as a certificate course.
- Encourage the students to enroll in association with the CDC department after mapping with the skillsets as required by the industry.
- Value-added courses as a part of the internal assessment.
- Linking of value-added courses with ACE scorecard/Employability scorecard.
- Offering a compulsory non-credit course.
- Can be offered as part of the Dean's list or through the Mentor-Mentee system. For evaluation, inter-department competition could be conducted with cash incentives/prizes.

The Members noted that interdisciplinary projects (IDP) were executed in all UG programs (excluding programs with statutory restrictions) from the 2020 batch onwards in semester III. Dr. Kler informed the Members that a workshop is planned to be organized at the end of October 2021 to bring parity in evaluation mats.

1st Internal Quality Assurance Committee Meeting for AY 2021-22

The Committee was **apprised** that policy on slow and advanced learners was approved by the Academic Council of Adamas University however the execution is yet to be done. The Members **suggested** that identification of slow learners to done based on marks obtained by the students in the test conducted by faculty members in this session and based on the analysis extra classes/ remedial classes to be offered to the slow learners. The progress of the student could be further analyzed in the second and the subsequent test in this session.

Agenda Item No. 9:

Proposal for the establishment of a greywater treatment facility in food court drainage

The Committee after deliberation **approved** the proposal **(Annexure 1.9)** submitted by Prof. (Dr.) Jitendra Kumar Pandey, Pro–Vice Chancellor (R&D Affairs) and Dean – SOBAS for the establishment of a greywater treatment facility in the food court drainage area.

The Chair **advised** to collaborate and initiate the project with **the** School of Smart Agriculture so that the same facility can be used for SOSA teaching and learning activities.

The Committee **noted** the feedback received from the employers and alumni for the year 2020-21 (Annexure 1.10).

Appreciating the feedback survey activity, the Members advised Mr. Abhijit Giri, Director – Career Development Cell to refine the survey form and conduct the survey in two different timeframes, one post-interview of the students and the other, post student's placement to have a clear insight of the student quality.

The Chair suggested submitting a school-wise analysis report on the feedback received from employers.

The Chair **appreciated** the new initiative taken and **recommended** writing a white paper on the perspective of the stakeholders on quality in higher education post the stakeholder panel discussion event. The Committee further **recommended** celebrating Quality month every year in the month of November.

Presentation on NIRF Results 2021 – Adamas University, Presentation by Dr. Aditya Ghosh, Member, office of QAA

The Committee **deliberated** on the NIRF results in 2021 (**Annexure 1.13**) and the chair has expressed his concern about Adamas University not being reflected on the ranking scale and **advised** schools to strategize their working based on NIRF parameters.

Agenda Item No. 14:

Adamas University collaboration with E-learning LinkedIn



The Members noted the University's collaboration (Annexure 1.14) with the LinkedIn Learning platform which provides access to both faculty and students of Adamas University and encourage/empower the students to learn beyond boundaries, explore the world of augmented learning and upskill themselves with industry-required skills from industry / academic experts.

Establishment of E-YUVA center in association with BIRAC (Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council) - Verbal Status by Dr. Saptarshi Chatterjee

The Committee members congratulated Dr. Saptarshi Chatterjee for successfully establishing the first E-YUVA center (Annexure 1.15) supported by BIRAC, receiving a grant with an amount worth around 2.66 crores for the next three years to be used for empowering youth to undertake the value-added innovative translational research in the field of life science and allied.

Psychometric analysis and training will be conducted for the selected women and whoever crosses the barrier will be offered the job.

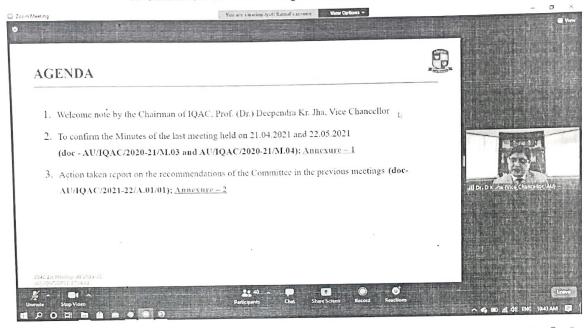

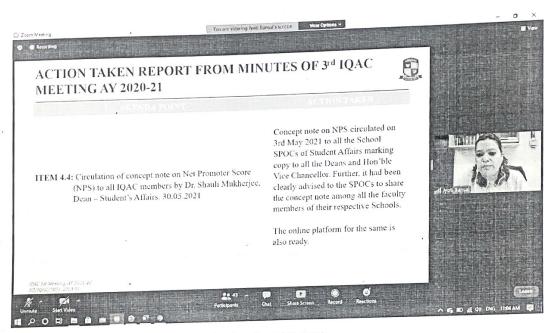

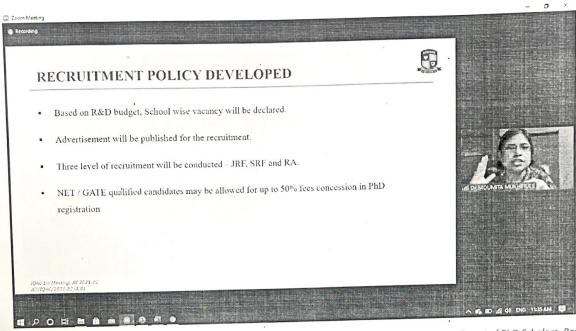

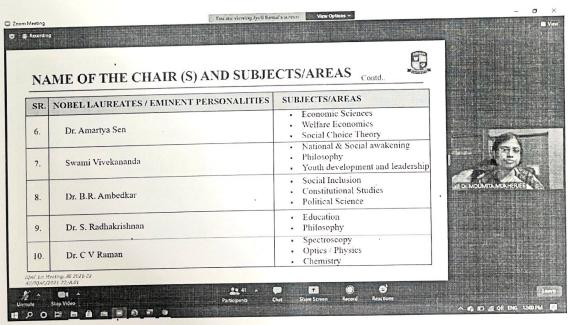
Picture 3: Ms. Jyoti Bansal, Director, IQAC presenting the action taken report



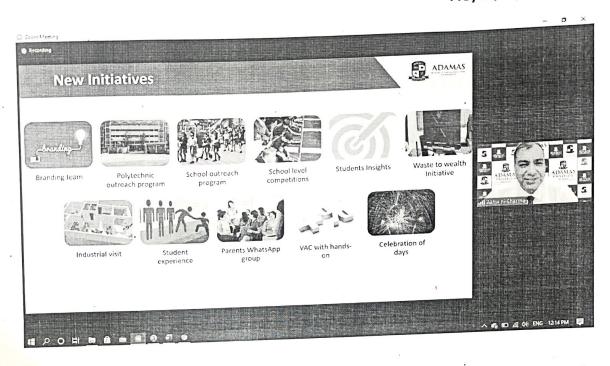
Picture 4: Dr. Sumona Dutta, Assistant Professor presenting the update of psychometric profiling for AU students

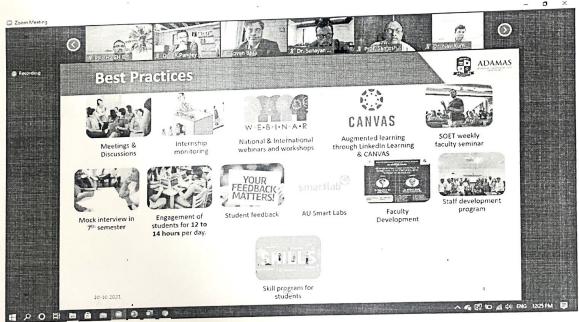

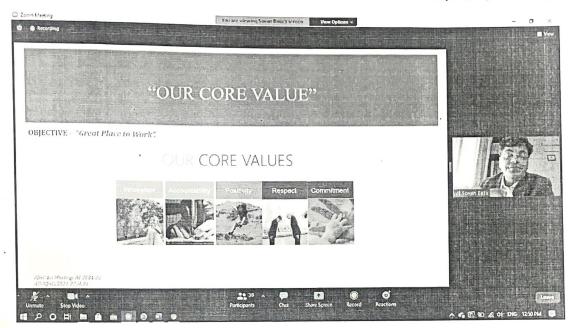


· Picture 6: Dr. Moumita Mukherjee, Dean R&D, proposed the appointment of Chair Professors for the University

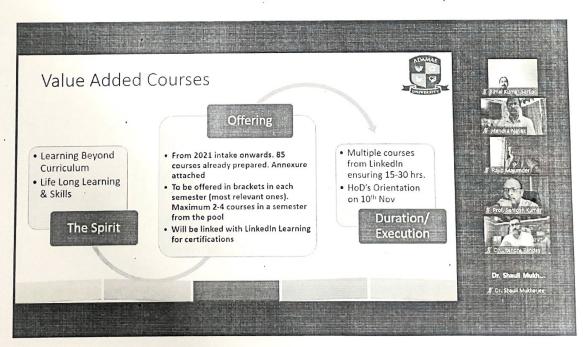




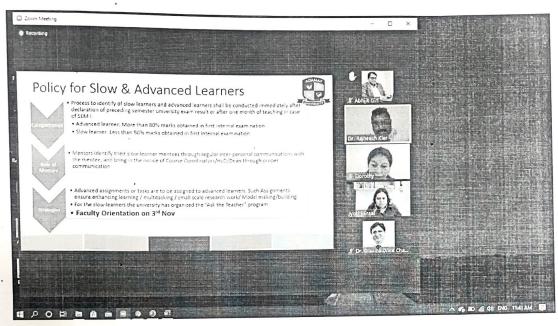
Picture 7 & 8: Dr. Ashwini Kumar Sharma, Dean SOET presented the new Initiatives and best practices of SOET



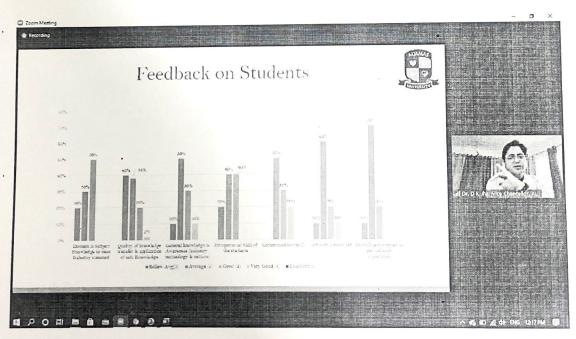
Picture 9: Mr. Sovan Basu, Director HR apprising the members on employee engagement culture and AU employee engagement principle



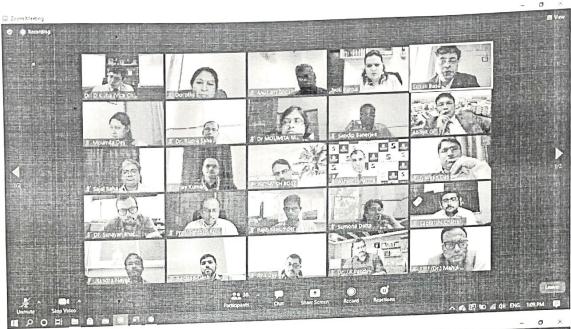
Picture 10: Esteem Members deliberating on the execution of value-added courses
