3. Introduction

- Briefly introduce the research area.
- Explain the motivation behind the research.
- State the research question or hypothesis.
- Summarize the Chapters of the thesis. (Title only)

4. Literature Review

- a. Summarize key literature relevant to the research.
- b. Highlight gaps in the existing research that your study addresses.
- c. Discuss theoretical frameworks, experimental set-up or models you are using.

5. Research Objectives

- a. Clearly outline the objectives of your study. (in bullet)
- b. Explain how these objectives relate to your research question.

6. Methodology

- a. Describe the research design (qualitative, quantitative, mixed methods, simulation, fabrication process).
- b. Explain your data collection methods (surveys, interviews, experiments, etc.).
- c. Discuss your data analysis techniques.

7. Results

- a. Present key findings from your research. (Chapter Wise)
- b. Use graphs, tables, or charts to illustrate data. Mention Publication in footnote of the slide.
- c. Highlight any unexpected results (if any)

8. Discussion

- a. Interpret the results in the context of your research question.
- b. Discuss implications for theory, practice, and future research.

- c. Address any limitations of your study.

9. Conclusion

- a. Summarize key points of your presentation.
- b. Restate the significance of your research.
- c. Offer recommendations for future research.

10. Acknowledgments

- a. Thank your advisors, funding authority (if any), committee members, and anyone who contributed to your research.

11. . Q&A Session

- a. Invite questions and feedback from the audience.
- b. Prepare to address potential criticisms or concerns.
